- Participates each spring in the Chesapeake Bay Alliance's "Project Clean Stream" by removing trash from selected streams & wetlands in the county.
- Is a member of the Maryland Watershed Network, the Nanticoke Watershed Alliance, and ShoreRivers.
- Performs water testing at strategic sites on the county's rivers & tributaries to establish baselines and trigger pollution alerts as required.
- Supports smart growth and affordable housing located conveniently to schools, shopping, and transportation.
- Publishes a newsletter which highlights environmental and land use issues in the county.
